



Voting System

Policy Statement

Policies should be determined by Australian citizens for the benefit of Australians.

The affairs of the Nation must lie in the hands of law abiding people of sound mind, so that we may build for the future.

Policy

One Nation will implement changes to the preferential voting procedure:

- The voters must be allowed to stop their preferences at any point on the ballot paper, instead of being required to list all candidates.
- The Electoral Commission alone will be responsible for displaying HTV Cards and only inside polling stations. No "How-to-vote" - cards must be allowed to be handed out at election time.
- Electoral funding will be provided after a "qualifying" minimum of 2% of primary votes received.
- Only Australian citizens will be eligible to vote.

One Nation wishes to see a tightening of the identification procedures for voting to provide a requirement for use of a drivers license or other photo ID for all voters.

One Nation would examine the potential for far wider use of technology at election time and for referendums to counter fraud.
